It is to be noted currently all the contracts with international consultants (Jensen Hughes, WSP, Tüv Süd) have expired, new invitation to tender in this regard can be considered. Training can be conducted online/video calls. MD suggested an Environmental Sustainability manager is recruited who could act as a key person for the communications with GIZ.	
Roger (Brands) commented that RSC budget has gone through in- depth review at RSC FC and supported and commended the RSC 2020-21 budget for approval. Both RSC FC members Miran (Industry) and Anam (Labour) supported and commended the budget for approval.	
The Convenor summarised the BoD's consensus to approve the 2020-21 budget as presented by the MD inclusive of the "must haves" and requested that the Co-Chairs declare their approval.
